• .PSD

 Native Adobe Photoshop file that saves work so projects and individual components can be edited.



• .JPEG/.JPG

 Popular bitmap photograph / image file format. A compressed (lossy) image that has a small file size.



• .GIF

• Index bitmap file type (256 colors) that can also contain frame by frame animations. 256 colors makes this file not ideal for photographs.



• .TIFF

 Bitmap file commonly used for desktop publishing. Lossless file format (uncompressed) leads to larger file sizes compared to JPEG.



.PNG

• Popular lossless (uncompressed) bitmap file that can maintain transparency.



• .EPS

 A meta format that contains vector and raster data that can be used with a wide range of software.

• .PDF

• Universal vector file format that all computers are able to view using a PDF reader program.





Exporting Individual Project Elements

- Using Photoshop to export individual layers or elements instead of an entire design.
 - To export one or more layers only:
 - Go to the Layer menu > Select Export layer

Exporting Files

File Metadata

• Extra information embedded in a file. Information can include date created, camera type, lens used, author, and copyright status.

Publishing Graphics

• Preparing (exporting and saving) graphics to be used for a specific purpose.

Optimize for Web Delivery

Optimizing, saving, and exporting graphics to be used on websites.

Exporting Files

Prepare for Print Delivery

Optimizing, saving, and exporting graphics to be printed.

Images for Video Delivery

• Optimizing, saving, and exporting graphics to be used in video.

Safe Zones:

 Area in a design that ensures all elements will be printed properly. Objects outside of the safe zone might be printed incorrectly.

Exporting Files

- Saving to the computer vs. saving to the cloud
 - Saving works in progress or finished projects to the hard drive on the computer or to the cloud (can be accessed from any device that can connect to the internet).
